Biographies of Washington Township Trustee Candidates

Candidate Name: Frank T. Short, Democrat (Incumbent)

Running for: Washington Township Trustee, Marion County

Frank T. Short is a devoted public servant, serving on the City-County Council for three terms from the Southside of the City and is currently the Washington Township Trustee on the Northside. He is a small business owner and President of an Indiana property and casualty insurance company. Frank received a Juris Doctorate from Indiana University-Indianapolis and a Bachelor's degree from Indiana Wesleyan.
